Delivery of Cyber A.C.E.S to your classroom

Phase I of the Cyber STARS will focus on launching our mentorship program and delivery of the Palo Alto Networks Cyber A.C.E.S (16 lessons for kids aged 5 to 15) to students in schools serving large numbers of Black and brown students.
